The new code will help children and young people to understand the simple behaviours that will enable them to enjoy the internet safely.

To date we have completed half of the PROTECT training events, with another two dates being confirmed for shortly after Safer Internet Day.

There are 70 schools confirmed to receive a PROTECT volunteer for SID and a large number of schools confirming their interest for a volunteer to attend their schools in the following term - meaning we are hopefully well on track to hit for hitting this year's target of children to be trained through PROTECT.

Facebook reacted very quickly to my email and provided the following response which includes an email address for direct contact :-

Thanks for bringing this to our attention. After reviewing the reported abuse, we have removed the account per our Terms of Use.

In the future, please feel free to use the "Report" links located near most pieces of content on the site to report offensive material to Facebook. If you are not able to use the "Report" links for any reason, please write to us at privacy@facebook.com with a link to the offensive material and a description of the problem. We will then review this material and take the appropriate action. Please be assured, these reports will be kept confidential.

Hope this you find this useful and Facebook resolve your issue as quickly as they resolved ours.

Teaching critical thinking for our digital world

Digital literacy is the combination of skills, knowledge and understanding that young people need to learn in order to participate fully and safely in an increasingly digital world.
